

What is it?

- Cocaine is an extremely powerful central nervous system stimulant, or "upper."
- Cocaine acts directly on the brain's "pleasure centers," which causes changes in brain activity.
- People often use cocaine to change their moods and mental state.

Side Effects

- Increased body temperature, heart rate, and blood pressure
- Headaches
- Abdominal pain and nausea
- Decreased appetite
- Irritability, restlessness, anxiety, and paranoia
- Paranoid psychosis (loss of touch with reality and auditory hallucinations)
- Loss of smell, nosebleeds, and a chronically runny nose
